
## <u>Dinosaurs - Part Two</u>





An introductory activity can be used as the Squirrels arrive at the meeting place – colouring or simple puzzles can keep children occupied until all the Drey arrives or use a 'joining-in' style game, such as 'The farmer wants a wife' or 'Duck, duck, goose' or a circle format ball game.

Add snack time where necessary!

TIME (mins)	ACTIVITY	EQUIPMENT
5	Welcome, Register, Opening Ceremony, Introduction to Programme	
10	GAME: Dino Bones  Scatter bone-shaped dog biscuits across one end of the hall  Divide the Drey into teams, standing in lines (one team member behind the other) at the other end of the hall  In turn team members run down and collect a 'dino bone' – Tesco Small Bite biscuit bone selection come in a variety of colours so each team can collect a particular colour!  NB - be aware of allergies to touching dog treats!	Dog bone shaped treats
20	ACTIVITY: Pre-historic lands Allow the Squirrels to create their own dinosaurs using paper plates and a variety of art materials! A paper plate cut in half makes a good brontosaurus-shaped body, with the remaining half cut into head and tail shapes – attach to the body with selotape and add legs! Spikes or horns can be added to make a stegosaurus or triceratops variety! Once everyone has made their paper 'plateosuarus' create a gigantic pre-historic scene – a pre-historic land of huge plants and ferns could be made with paint or collage materials, perhaps real ferns and leaves could be added! Add a dinosaur nest made from sticks and leaves with cardboard eggs! Or, following on from the previous game Dino Bones, create a huge dinosaur skeleton from card board tubes and cardboard! These ideas would be a fun way to get the Drey involved in the I'm Friendly Smile Badge Drey big 'art attack' activity!	Paper plates, card, paper Art materials Googly eyes Collage items – as wished
10	ACTIVITY: Dino Lotto Print dinosaur lotto boards, one per small group of Squirrels. The boards can be printed on to different coloured sheets of lightweight card. To make a more durable resource, laminate the sheets.  Laminators are available from Argos stores and most supermarkets, such as Tesco, sell good quality laminating pouches.  Give each group a lotto sheet. A Leader calls out a picture from the set of master cards, if the Squirrels have that picture they cover it with a counter or button – if using laminated sheets then a dry wipe marker could be used to cross out the picture.  Each group could have their own set of nine counters or could take turns to run to a Leader to get a counter each time!	Lotto boards Set of master cards Counters, buttons or dry wipe markers



10	GAME: Who's extinct?	A lightweight blanket
	<ul> <li>Explain that during this game one of the 'dinosaurs' will</li> </ul>	
	become extinct, they will be covered by a blanket and the	
	others will have to guess which Squirrel is missing. Ensure that all Squirrels are happy to be covered by the blanket!	
	<ul> <li>The Squirrels move about the hall, when a Leader calls 'Who's extinct?' they all curl up on the floor and the Leader covers one of them with the blanket</li> </ul>	
	They are then asked to guess which 'dinosaur' has become extinct!	
	O If time allows, continue until everyone has had a turn at being covered by the blanket! If the Drey is large this game could be played in two groups with two blankets or in a circle format with the children moving around in a circle!
