

Paw Patrol – Keep Safe!



Many elements of the Squirrel Smile Badges criteria help the Squirrels develop team work and good citizenship. The pups from the TV programme Paw Patrol bring their own unique personality and skills to the team and work together to protect their community! Some of the activities below will help the Squirrels think about safety in their own homes!

An introductory activity can be used as the Squirrels arrive at the meeting place – colouring or simple puzzles can keep children occupied until all the Drey arrives or use a 'joining-in' style game, such as 'The farmer wants a wife' or 'Duck, duck, goose' or a circle format ball game. Add snack time where necessary!

10	<p>GAME: Paw Patrol Pups</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Explain that Paw Patrol pups help to keep everyone safe! ○ Print some black and white pictures of the pups from Paw Patrol and stick up around the hall ○ When a Leader calls the pup's name the Squirrels race to the appropriate picture! ○ There's Marshall, Chase, Rocky, Skye, Zuma, Rubble and, latest edition, Everest! <p>For pictures of the puppy team and their badges – check out these websites! www.nickjnr.co.uk/create/make/paw-patrol www.morningkids.net/coloring-pages-997-en-paw-patrol.html</p>	<p>Pictures of Paw patrol pups Blutack</p>
20	<p>ACTIVITY: Paw Patrol – new members wanted!</p> <p>Each member of the Paw Patrol team has a different job to do – Marshall is the Fire Dog, Chase the Police Pup and Skye the Pilot! Encourage the Squirrels to decide what kind of dog they would like to be if they joined Paw Patrol and what special skills they would have. They can design and draw the new Paw Patrol team member! Each pup has a simple badge which illustrates their skill – Rocky is an ECO Pup looking after the environment by recycling – his symbol is a recycling logo. The Squirrels can work out a special Paw Patrol badge logo for their new pup!</p>	<p>Paper Art materials Paw Patrol badge template Examples of Paw Patrol badges</p>
10	<p>GAME: Tidy Up Pup</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The aim of this game is to teach the Squirrels the dangers in leaving toys lying around where someone could trip and fall, especially on the stairs! ○ This game can be played in teams as a relay game or if the Drey is small everyone can do it together ○ Set the box or basket out and scatter the toys, etc. around the hall – ensure there is space so no-one trips! ○ Play some lively music as the Squirrels are busy collecting up the toys and other items ○ Emphasise that they should always tidy away their toys, books, etc. to help keep their house safe! 	<p>Selection of toys, balls, books, etc. Large cardboard or plastic box or laundry basket CD & lively music</p>



10	<p>ACTIVITY: Little Memory Game Divide the Drey into small groups for this activity, each group supervised by a member of the Leadership team. Toys left lying around can be dangerous but many of the Drey will have baby brothers or sisters who could choke if they swallowed small items! If a small toy or object fits into a toilet paper tube it can choke! Ask the Squirrels to think of anything small that they may play with, e.g. - Lego or Playmobil pieces, marbles or small bouncy balls, crayons and felt pen caps, dice, un-inflated balloons or pieces of burst balloons! Ordinary household items are dangerous too - coins, buttons, tiny batteries, safety pins, screws, jewellery, beads, dried peas, etc.!</p> <p>Place some small items on a tray, allow the Squirrels to study them, and then cover with a cloth and remove an item. Remove the cloth and see if the Squirrels can guess which item is missing!</p>	<p>For each group: Tray Selection of small items Cloth</p>
